Competition mode:

- The competition number will be decided by lot.
- Once in the whole team competition (qualification + final) a substitute shooter can be substituted, who then remains in the team for the rest of the competition.
- There are no mixed teams of substitute shooters.
- Jump-off (places 1-3): In the jump-off the shooters shoot one arrow each until a score is reached (Izume).

Team qualification:

Two rounds of 4 arrows each will be shot in Kyoudgi-Maai, which will be scored according to saiten-seido (scoring for the quality of the overall performance).

Qualification criteria:

- At least 9 hits (out of 24 possible in 2 rounds).
- Ranking will be according to saiten-seido points, in case of a tie the hits will decide. In case of a further tie, the competition management will decide on the further procedure.
- About 1/3 of the competing teams should reach the finals. The competition management will announce the exact number of possible teams in the finals directly before the start of the qualification.

Method of awarding points

The maximum possible points per round are as follows:

Entrance: 5	max. 5 points per arrow = max. 20 points per archer	max. 12 hits per team

max. 10 points per team	max. 20 points per team (mean value over whole team)	

*For scoring: 5=impressive; 4=very good; 3=okay; 2=okay, but with errors; 1=many errors; 0=incorrect.
 Half points can also be given*

The achieved points (averaged over all judges) will be published

Team finals:

The finals will be scored according to tekichu-seido, i.e. hit ratio. A maximum of 3 rounds of Kyoudgi-Ma'ai with 4 arrows each will be shot. In case of lack of time the number of rounds can be reduced by the competition management.

Competition mode:

- The competition number will be decided by lot.
- Jump-off (places 1-3):
 - The archers shoot max. 4 times each one arrow (Izume).
 - If no result is achieved, the archers shoot one arrow each at a common mato. The winner is the one whose arrow is closest to the mato center (enkin).

Single qualification:

Three rounds of 2 arrows each will be shot in Shinsa-Ma'ai, which will be scored according to saiten-seido (scoring for the quality of the overall performance).

Qualification criteria:

- At least 3 hits (out of 6 possible in 3 rounds).
- Ranking will be according to saiten-seido points, in case of a tie the hits will decide. In case of a further tie, the competition management will decide on the further procedure.
- About 1/3 of the competing teams should reach the finals. The competition management will announce the exact number of possible archers in the finals directly before the start of the qualification.

Method of awarding points

The maximum possible points per round (in Shinsa Ma'ai) are as follows:

TAIHAI	HASSETSU	HITS
Entrance: 5	max. 5 points Hassetsu part 1 per arrow	max. 2 hits
Exit: 5	max. 5 points Hassetsu part 2 per arrow	
max. 10 points	max. 20 points	

*For scoring: 5=impressive; 4=very good; 3=okay; 2=okay, but with errors; 1=many errors; 0=incorrect.
Half points can also be given*

The achieved points (averaged over all judges) will be published

Single finals:

The finals will be scored according to tekichu-seido, i.e. hit ratio. A maximum of 2 rounds of Kyoudgi-Ma'ai with 4 arrows each will be shot. In case of lack of time the number of rounds can be reduced by the competition management.

The archer with the best individual result is the winner.

The best Austrian archer receives the Austrian challenge cup.

Registration deadline:

Team competition: Until **27th May 2023** the team registration has to be sent to the board of the association. In case of a registration of more than 3 teams per club, the association board has to be contacted in advance!

Individual competition: A pre-registration for the individual competition by the clubs to the association board until May 27, 2023 is requested

The saiten-seido scoring will be done according to the method decided in the EKF AGM 2022. Arrows with bullet or sand points are permitted

Evaluation: The evaluation of the saiten-seido protocols is software-based.
